MOIRA CO-OP ATM ATTEMPTED THEFT

Three men have been charged with the attempted theft of a cash machine in Moira. Officers were called to the incident in the early hours of Thursday 7th July at the Co-op in Shortheath Road, Moira.

A 27, 32 and 33-year-old man have been charged with conspiracy to commit burglary.

They are:

John Price, 27 of Stoke-on-Trent

Luke Price, 32 of St. Helens

Arthur Gaskin, 33 of no fixed abode.

The charges relate to the incident in Moira, as well as a number of other burglary offences in the Cheshire area.

MOIRA

09/07/2022 – Bath Lane – damage to fence and abusive behaviour from youths

09/07/2022 – School Lane – anti-social behaviour 20+ youths drinking on field

12/07/2022 – Shortheath Road – male having seizure in the road and then became violent

13/07/2022 – Co-op Shortheath Road – several males enter shop and fill basket with goods then leave without paying.

13/07/2022 – Co-op Shortheath Road – teenagers with slingshots – no damage caused

14/07/2022 – Moira Workshops, Furnace Lane – unknown suspects broke into site and stole items.

16/07/2022 – Co-op Shortheath Road, Moira – on-going issues with youths causing anti-social behaviour and stealing goods – Sentinel report created 134489.

18/07/2022 – Shortheath Road – youths jumping in canal

23/07/2022 – Ashby Road – driver failed roadside breath test

23/07/2022 – Conkers – youths throwing bricks and chairs at customers

24/07/2022 – Measham Road – units broken into and multiple tools taken

25/07/2022 – Moira Furnace – damage to fence by canal lock

The beat team are aware of ASB in Moira over the last few weeks. The group have been causing issues at the Conker's site, Moira Furnace and Co-op in the village with reports of damage, verbal abuse and littering to name a few. Warning letters have been personally delivered by officers to all those identified. They have been given words of advice and a warning in the company of their parents and advice regarding the next stages of police action should their anti-social behaviour continue. Those who have been identified regarding criminal matters have also been dealt with. Regular patrols of the area are taking place.

#LivesNotKnives

Are you concerned about a young person?

Family, friends, teachers and role models are an important influence on a young person, and you can have a powerful effect. It might be a difficult conversation – but talking about knife carrying is critical to finding a solution.

When you speak to a young person, it's important to be clear that they have a choice, even when they think they may not.

Step 1: Find a **time to chat** comfortably

Step 2: They might be **reluctant to talk** to you, so why not use **recent news** as a **conversation** starter

Step 3: **Discuss** each other's views on **knives**, remember you're there to **listen** and **support** them.

Step 4: **Understand** that they might **feel** like they don't have any other **choices**, support them to see that they do.

Step 5: **Explain** that knives do not give protection. Carrying one could mean **prison** or **getting hurt** themselves.

Step 6: Say the **bravest** thing to do is to walk away from a **dangerous** situation

Step 7: Explore **excuses** with them that they can use to **walk away**

Step 8: For example they might say they have to pick up younger sibling or you could arrange to **call them** if they send you a **message**.

Step 9: Reassure them that most people their age and older **do not carry knives**

Step 10: Explain they can always **report their concerns** about anyone carrying a knife **anonymously** through **Fearless**, an organisation designed to help young people.





NEIGHBOURHOOD LINK

Neighbourhood Link is a community messaging service from Leicestershire Police that provides news and information about policing activity or initiatives, crime prevention advice as well as major incidents affecting your area.

Through this service you can receive messages from your local Neighbourhood Policing Team, local police or, in the event of a major incident or event affecting the whole of Leicestershire, from a partnership of agencies known as the Local Resilience Forum.



In order to receive messages you will need to register your details. Registration is free and simple to follow.
